ACHIEVEMENTS AND ADVOCACY

On December 20th, the Sexual Violence Legislation Bill passed its final reading.

This has been an unexpectedly long road since its first reading on 14 November 2019, but lobbying has supported most of the key changes to reduce retraumatisation of victims of sexual violence being passed into law.

These include:

- extension of the rape shield to prior sexual activity with the defendant
- · extension of communication assistance
- · improved judicial direction
- the requirement that the judge intervene with questions they consider to be improper, unfair, misleading or too complicated

The latter is a highlight particularly for child complainants. Changes to trial process are also needed to reduce retraumatisation further, but this is a significant step.

INTERSECTIONALITY AND DIVERSITY AT HELP

As sexual violence impacts on people of all gender identities and sexual orientations, HELP is developing a wider understanding of how the rainbow community experiences the world and may be exposed to sexual violence.

Angelo says, "It is an exciting time to join the team as the Rainbow Community Lead for HELP Auckland... up until now in Aotearoa there have been no effective targeted sexual violence initiatives that exist to reduce violence enacted upon or occurring within rainbow communities.
